The investment objective of the Fund is to seek to achieve total return consisting of high current income and potential capital appreciation through investments in the common stock of closed-end management investment companies that invest significantly in equity or income-producing securities.

Since certain distributions received by the funds from closed-end fund investments (CEFs) may consist of dividend income, return of capital and capital gains, and the character of these distributions cannot be determined until after the end of the year, the SEC yield has been adjusted for the funds that invest significantly in CEFs based on estimates of return of capital and capital gains.

(4) Most recently declared monthly distribution. As portfolio and market conditions change, future distributions may also change. Distributions are subject to recharacterization for tax purposes after the end of the fiscal year. The Fund is currently paying distributions in excess of its net investment income, which may result in a return of capital. Absent this, the yield would have been lower. 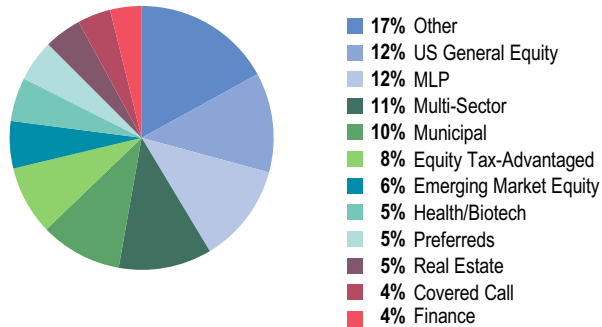
